There are about 16 species of Macaw in the wild. Although in captivity we have hybridized several of them. 9 of them are endangered.






Breeding Potential

How am I born?

We mate for life. We nest in hole in trees, 2 eggs are the normal clutch size. The eggs are incubated for 28 days. We are born blind and featherless. In a few week we open our eyes and start getting feathers. The chicks fledge from the nest in about 90 days.



How long does it take me to grow up and how long do I live

By the time I have fledged and am ready to leave the nest I am ready to try flying and I am already as big as I will get. Over the next few months I will add bulk but not get bigger. I can live up to 100 years if well cared for.
