How long does it take me to grow up and how long do I live

At about 10 days old my eyes will open and I will start to get my down feathers. I get my fledgling feathers at about 3 weeks. At 5 weeks I will be able to leave the nest and will be weaned and eating on my own a week later. My average life span is 7 years

What kind of family life do I have?

In the wild we can be seen in flocks some as small as 100 birds others as large as 25,000 birds. As a cage bird we like to be in groups as we are a very social bird.

What do I eat and when do I eat?

In the wild we eat grass seeds but domestic budgies eat a variety of seeds, greens and fruits



Who are my predators?

Most Budgies are lost because of illnesses. These come from a variety of sources, molds, parasites, viral infections, poisoning, shock and respiratory diseases.
