I hatch from an egg. The eggs are very small, smaller than a quarter. My eggs was white in color. A normal clutch size is 3 eggs. We are incubated for 24 to 26 days.

How long does it take me to grow up and how long do I live

After I hatch from my egg it will take another 8 to 10 weeks for my down to turn to feathers. At that age I will be fledged out and can learn to fly. I will be about 12 inches tall from the top of my head to the tip of my tail. In captivity if I am well cared for I will live up to 40 years.

What kind of family life do I have?

I like to have human companions but will get along fine with other birds. When breeding, males can be aggressive and need plenty of room in the breeding cage.

What do I eat and when do I eat?

I eat a variety of Fruit and seeds, like safflower, millet and sunflower seeds. I like my food first thing in the morning so I can nibble all day long. I will sort through it for my favorite seeds.



Who are my predators?

Loss of habitat due to Japanese loggers and illegal trade have caused their numbers to go down in the wild.
