Physical Characteristics:

am a type of sheep that does not produce wool. Unlike my relative the goat, only male sheep have horns. I have a split hoof and a foot print that looks similar to that of a deer.

Habitat / Climate Sheep are found all over the world in all types of climates.	Where am I from? The Barbado breed originated in Texas. They originated from Barbados Blackbelly sheep, which are a cross of the Rambouillet and mouflon, and came either from West Africa or the island of Barbados.
Other family members: Bison Impalas Antelope Sheep	Who are my relatives? I am a mammal from the order <i>Artiodactyla</i> and the family <i>Bovidae</i> , which includes cattle, antelopes, gazelles, sheep, springboks, hartebeest and relatives. I am directly related to the Babados Blackbelly sheep. The Blackbelly males have horns
Breeding Potential Sheep have a gestation period of about 5 ½ months. They have 1-2 young at time.	How am I born? I am born precocial, which means that I am able to get up and follow my mom very shortly after I am born. I am a herd animal and so females will often have young about the same time and the herd will often keep the young together toward the center of the herd.
Breeding Season	How long does it take me to grow up and how long do I live? I will be sexually mature at 18 months and live from 8-13 years.
Sheep can have young year round Names for: dult male- Ram dult female- Ewe	What kind of family life do I have? Sheep are considered to be the oldest domesticated animal. One reason for this is their tendency to stay in herds. Nomadic people were able to easily travel with a herd of sheep.
foung- Lamb or fearling - Hogget froup:- Flock	What do I eat and when do I eat? I am a diurnal grazer (eat grass during the day) like cattle and goats I am a ruminant which means that I chew my food twice.
