I got my name from the Chincha Indians who used me for food and clothing. In the 1600's the Spaniards in South America sought after my fur with the same determination that they had for gold and jewels. When the British began to mine in the Andes they brought in foxes to hunt for sport. The foxes began to hunt the chinchillas for food. My family nearly became extinct. Only 60 years ago there were many of us in our mountain homes. The Incas valued our flesh and fur they called us "little sunshine" Furriers found they could get rich on our coats and hunted us almost to extinction. An American named Mathias Chapman Spent 4 years capturing 11 of us. He started breeding us in captivity and saved our family. Finally the government stepped in and outlawed the exportation of the fur in 1918.
