**How am I born?** My gestation period is only 28 to 31 days. I am born naked, blind and helpless. We are a pretty big family usually about seven of us kitts and mother does not pay

much attention to us. She has several litters a year. That's just too many children to keep up

## What kind of family life do I

Most of us are solitary and sometimes territorial, coming together only to breed or occasionally to forage in small groups. During territorial disputes we will sometimes "box," using our front limbs. Rabbits are active throughout the year; no species is known to hibernate. We are generally nocturnal, and also are very quiet. Other than loud screams when frightened or caught by a predator, the only auditory signal known for most species is a loud foot thump made to indicate alarm or aggression.

## What do I eat and when do I eat?

Rabbits are herbivores who feed by grazing on grass, forbs, and leafy weeds. We graze heavily the first half hour of our grazing period (usually in the late afternoon), and then half an hour of more selective feeding. If the environment is non-threatening, we will remain outdoors for many hours, grazing at intervals.

Who are my predators? Anything that eats meat.
