There are wild populations of moufflon still in existence: the Asiatic mouflon which is still found in the mountains of Asia Minor and southern Iran and the European mouflon of which the only existing members are on the islands of Sardinia and Corsica.

After we are several weeks old, lamb marking—the process of ear tagging, docking, and castrating—is carried out. Ewes generally reach sexual maturity at six to eight months of age, and rams generally at four to six months.

We are grazers we spend all day wandering to the best spots to find grass.
